Travellers – Why are these so difficult?

Travellers travel with their board, and are named by that board – not by the first pair to fill them in.

Normally they are filled in by N. Here we do 4, for practice, which are filled in by E, S & W. Please ensure the scoring is done from N's point of view.

It is good that you know that you can look the score up on the rear of the bidding cards – but that isn't sufficient – you need to know the values of basic contracts (or be able to work them out) "just like that".

Minors: tricks * 20 Majors: tricks * 30

No Trumps: tricks * 30 + 10

Part score: 50

Game: 300 or 500


Small slam: 500 or 750 on top of game bonus

Undertricks: undertricks * 50 or 100

Travellers – Why are these so difficult?

What is a System Card?

A System Card is the modern name for a Convention Card (because it includes more than just Conventions).

Its prime purpose is to inform your opponents what "system" you play. It has the side effect of being able to remind your own partnership of what system you have agreed to play. You may look at **your** system card between hands. You may look at your opponents' system cards effectively whenever you wish – being sensible about it.

The system card of any partnership is identical for both players – it is not allowed for one player to play one system and their partner another.

The next few slides show Pauline and Steve's Convention card as of July last year. We revise it relatively frequently, and we take it with us to clubs we play at. It is still incomplete, but covers most of what we play. I do not suggest that you use the same system card.

Most folk use a simpler version based on the results card.

May devalue hand 1pt for 4333 shape with poor intermediates.

Response to 1NT: Intervention cancels conventions

Stayman 2C: "STAYMAN"

11+HCP L4major

0..10HCP L5+major & L4+othermajor etc

Transfers: 2D->2H, 2H->2S, 2S->3C correct to 3D if needed.

(L6+Minor for Minor WTO)

Opening 1suit: 12..19+HCP; 10..11HCP rule of 20 & good intermediates.

Opening 2NT: 20..22HCP 4333, 4432, 5332 any seat "20 TO 22"

Response to 2NT (or stronger balanced opening):

Modified Baron 3C: 5+HCP L3/4major. ALERT

3Major=L5, 3D=L4Major, 3NT=No L4+Major

Transfers: 3D->3H, 3H->3S, 3S->4C correct to 4D if needed.

- 2H, 2S: "WEAK": 6..10HCP, L6, 2/4 top cards or 3/6 top cards
 Response 2NT: 16+HCP asking Quality Suit (s) & Hand (h) ALERT
 3C=s-h-, 3D=s+h-, 3H=s-h+, 3S=s+h+. ALERT
- Opening 3NT: Gambling: Solid minor suit L7+ headed by AKQJ, no more. Response: with L1+BothMinors and stops in 3 suits, may pass Else 4C correct to 4D if needed.
- Opening 3suit: Pre-empt L7suit 6..10HCP <=3HCP in other suits
 Opening 4suit: Pre-empt L8+suit 6..10HCP <=3HCP in other suits



Overcalls: (May be weaker when lead directing)

1NT: 15..18HCP balanced

3suit at first opportunity - as opening 3suit 4suit double jump - as opening 3suit (L7+)



CONVENTIONS et al

Gerber 4C: Ace asking over partner's NT without natural C bid

RKCB 4NT: Key Card ask over agreed suit, no void 0/3, 1/4, 2-Q, 2+Q

If suit unagreed, last suit bid.

4th suit forcing: Does not have 4th suit. ALERT below 3NT.

Asks partner to describe hand some more, bid NT with 4th suit.

Minor suit trial bid:

After 1minor-2minor. Stopper showing: A, Kx, Qxx, Jxxx.

Major suit trial bid: ALERT: After 1major-2major or 1major-3major.

Can partner help with 3 quick losers in suit?

Unassuming cue bid: ALERT

Opponents' suit at lowest level supports partner's suit

with 10+HCP and L4+suit



SIGNALS

Reverse Attitude: After opening Ace lead:

Low has 3rd round control, High does not.

DISCARDS

Revolving: High: Please lead non-trump suit above this;

Low: Please lead non-trump suit below this.

Don't forget

Evaluate length points immediately for non-NT bids.

Evaluate shortage points only after finding a fit.

Quantitative raises are not Blackwood.

Unbalanced long minors often play best in NT.

NT bids after opponents bid require stops in their suits.

When you have played a hand, pass it to the next numbered table in sequence. The highest numbered table passes to table 1.



This hand was asked to be bid using a STRONG NT. Final contract the same as board 7, which is the SAME hand except that suits have been swapped and the board rotated.
