Please, please, PLEASE:

- * fill then in from the point of view of North.
- * fill the information in using the top of each column to guide you.
- * get the player to your left to CHECK it,
 - (as you check that of the player to your right).
 - ** Is the checked line IDENTICAL to what you wrote?
 - ** Is the checked line in the right place? Does it overflow the row?
 - ** Has all the rewuired info been included? I ask for NS pair
 - EW pair
 - Contract and result (3NT+1, 5S-2, 4Hx=)
 - Declarer (N S E W)
 - Tricks made (0...13)
 - Score

Stayman

Stayman is covered in RWPB.

Only use Stayman when you have one or two exactly L4Majors.

Without L4Major and a L5+major use transfers (or whatever system you use). It is conceivable you may wish to use Stayman with TWO L5 majors, this is rare, refer to RNT#45.

Plan ahead and determine your reply to Stayman answers of 2S, 2H and 2D.

With a balanced (or near balanced?) hand and 11+ points and a misfit you can revert to 2NT. With 0..10 points you REALLY must have PLANNED.

Announce after 2C on 1NT opener. Alert Stayman after 1NT overcall, 2NT opener, 2C/2D/2NT opener.

This week we watched the second half of the Mr Bridge / Bernard Magee DVD "Responding to 1NT". An excellent explanation of Stayman. *We missed the final 10 minutes as the equipment failed – that wasn't actually Stayman as such, and will be shown at the next session.*

Play

Divide yourselves into pairs and then into tables.

This week I may ask you to move.


NS have the pair number of their table, N has his back to the screen. EW have the pair number of their table plus 8.

When you have played a hand, pass it to the next numbered table in sequence. The highest numbered table passes to table 1.

And one last thing – **as part of the learning process** – I would like the partner of whoever has just bid to take whatever action is **standardly required** (announcing 1NT to be 12-14 points, ALERTing a conventional bid, ...) – **AND ALSO** to give a brief **description** to the other three players on what the bid means.

RNT = B Magee DVD: Responding to 1NT

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Blue results from travellers

Red results are reference results.

Boards as played are rotated compared to the book / DVD presentation (which mostly make South dealer). Rotation defined by position of A.

The hands taken from the "RNT" DVD only provide 2 hands. I had to deal the other two hands. The "reference" results are what I worked out and are not canonical. A review with PAB after the session suggests some changes.

Note that sometimes a sacrificial "going down" is a good result.

Ref a is the DVD bidding. Strictly W isn't strong enough to overcall 2D, but it is an aggressive/competitive bid.

Sadly the intent of this hand is to show the bad things that can happen if you use Stayman with a plan. Unfortunately N has L5H and you find a fit – and it looks to me as though everyone used Stayman OR responded to a 2D overcall with 2H. *The N deal should have been adjusted to prevent this.*

4H= is poor defence. Some may open 1H not 1NT with L5H.
