
Week 13 Opening Leads (3)

Play

Divide yourselves into pairs and then into tables.

This week I may ask you to move.


NS have the pair number of their table, N has his back to the screen. EW have the pair number of their table plus 8.

When you have played a hand, pass it to the next numbered table in sequence. The highest numbered table passes to table 1.

And one last thing – **as part of the learning process** – I would like the partner of whoever has just bid to take whatever action is **standardly required** (announcing 1NT to be 12-14 points, ALERTing a conventional bid, ...) – **AND ALSO** to give a brief **description** to the other three players on what the bid means.

Set hand sources

All hands this week come from

AR:Leads = A Robson, Opening Leads

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Blue results from travellers

Red results are reference results.

Boards as played are rotated compared to the book / DVD presentation (which mostly make South dealer). Rotation defined by position of A.

For each board the reference opening lead hand is presented and the preferred lead (according to BM) shown.

For ALL these hands the reference result is that the contract is defeated. Poor opening leads or poor play would permit declarer to make the contract.

Not S (L1trump). Not D (Don't underlead A). Near top from rubbish H looks very poor. C have honour headed sequence of $2 + (\underline{T}9x)$.

Do not underlead A, but A from Ax: AH plausible but fails. Fourth highest from L4 clubs to two honours (Q-T) succeeds: 5C. 6D probably also good.

Recommended lead here is 3H which in this case works poorly.

In this case AH is recommended as it guarantees a look at dummy whilst retaining a H master. *No idea how you were meant to determine this lead.*

Unbid suits are D & C. Can't underlead AC and don't want to lead AC, so top of doubleton 7D, E ducks his AD. W wins later and leads 2nd D showing out.

Boards 8 & 9 were AR:Leads#10 and AR:Leads#40.
