

What do you bid?

Although you have 8 HCP and 10 Pts (+1 for L5H and +1 for L5D), each suit is weak. A 2-level bid is not recommended.

You do have enough to reply at the one level and this is a situation where you should use the "dustbin" bid to show 6..10 HCP in a hand unable to bid at the 2 level.

So 1NT.

RWPB

This week summarizes the first two chapters of the course book, with a little extra thrown in.

Recapping SGB's theory of honours.

AKQJ are honours

10 is an honour if the suit held also contains any of AKQJ9

This matters when opening leads promise (or deny) an honour and when bids include conditions such as "suit includes 2 honours".

Evaluating your hand

HCP: A=4 K=3 Q=2 J=1

Balanced hands: 31/4 31/4 31/4 31/4 -- 4333 -- 4432

For these hands, just use HCP.

For unbalanced hands, use Points which are HCP + Shape points.

Shape: Length add 1 for each card over L4suit.

Shape: Shortage ~ As well as length, but only once a fit (joint L8suit) found.

Length	Your suit	Their sui
2	1	1
1	2	3
0	3	5

Mnemonic: Your (4 letters) shorter than Their (5 letters); 123 less than 135.

Some players subtract 1 point in 4333 balanced hands.

Some players pass with 12 Pts being AAA, (may be only 3 tricks).

Point targets

RWPB lists a table of points required for a target bid.

It applies as HCP for NT bids.

It applies as Points for suited bids.

Opening bidding

0..5 Pass Some use 0..4

6..9 with a good long suit Some use 5..9 or 6..10

Open "weak 2" with L6 if you play this variant

Open 3 with L7

Open 4 with L8+

9,10..11 Open 1suit if Rule of 20 (9 occasionally)

Pass if balanced

12..14 Open 1NT if balanced, 1suit if not

15..19 Open 1suit (plan a NT rebid if balanced)

20..22 Open 2NT if balanced

23+ Open 2♣

8..9.5 playing tricks unbalanced Open "Strong 2" if you play this

10+ playing tricks unbalanced Open 2♣



Week 3 RWPB Summary - Ch1 & 2

Opening bidding

Opening 3NT is a gambling conventional bid showing AKQJxxx in a minor suit.

We are mostly learning basic Acol, there are other systems. For example...

Benjaminised Acol (aka Benji) Not in RWPB

https://www.ebu.co.uk/documents/laws-and-ethics/convention-cards/benji-acol.pdf

where *mostly*: 1 level bids are the same

2NT shows 19..20 HCP balanced

2♣ shows 8..9.5 playing tricks unbalanced or 21..22 HCP balanced

2 shows 10+ playing tricks unbalanced or 23+ HCP balanced

2♥♠ show 6..10 (or 5..9) HCP, L6♥♠ with 2 of top 3 OR 3 of top 5 honours ie the HAND may be weak, but the SUIT is strong

With 12..14 HCP, 5332 shape and L5♥♠, Decide with partner if you open 1♥♠ when the suit is rebiddable or if you always open 1NT

With 4441, Pass with 0..13 HCP (You need 14+ HCP to allow you to safely lie.)



Week 3 RWPB Summary - Ch1 & 2

Suit choice

Open NT when appropriate.

When opening a suit, bid your longest first – not your strongest.

EG Bid 1♥ with ♥98732 and ♠AQJ5

With two equal length longest suits

L4, L4 Bid Hearts if you can, else bid **Poorer** minor suit

L5+, L5+ Bid higher ranking (unless ♣♠, bid ♣).

With 4441 hands RWPB: Bid Hearts if you can, else bid **Poorer** minor suit

Others have schemes such as

With a red suit singleton open the suit below singleton.

With a black suit singleton open the middle of the 3 touching suits.

Opening suitA, rebidding suitB shows L5+suitA and L4+suitB.

Opening suitA, rebidding suitA shows L6+suitA 95% of the time.

Play

NS have the pair number of their table, N has his back to the stage. EW have the pair number of their table plus 8.

Play boards in sequence. Have an incoming pile and an outgoing pile. Pass outgoing to next lower numbered table – Table 1 to highest table.

As part of the learning process – I would like the partner of whoever has just bid to take whatever action is standardly required (eg announcing 1NT to be 12-14 points, ALERTing a conventional bid, ...) - AND ALSO to give a brief **description** to the other three players on what the bid means.



Red results are reference results.

Boards as played are rotated compared to the book presentation (which mostly make South dealer). Rotation defined by position of A♠.

Note attached to board: "NORTH READ BEFORE BIDDING" "With 12 hearts, you can guarantee 12 tricks (KH falls to AH, only loser is 7C). Open with a slam bid - #6H."

To open a slam, N must have 12 top tricks – anything else and this bid is folly and a normal strong opening bid (eg 2H or even 2C) would be appropriate. Therefore with 6 top tricks and L7C, E should sacrifice in 7C.
