

Each year we have two non-presentation, non-set-hands sessions that are played as full duplicate pairs.

November 2017 Tournament

Each member of the group is asked to find a partner and then to find another pair so that the event is played with full tables. In the event of difficulties, the organiser endeavours to "borrow an expert" from other U3A bridge players.

This time no requests for experts were made and we had 3 tables of entries.

With 120 minutes available, 10 are set aside for preparation and 10 for scoring leaving 100 minutes to play 10 boards – 10 minutes per board. This is slower than regular duplicate bridge clubs, but experience shows this to be what this group needs. We overran by 10 minutes!

All boards were freely dealt at the start of the session.

Movement

The movement is a 5 round, 2 board per round, 10 board, all play all movement. To achieve this, the boards are strangely mixed up and being "dealer" is not evenly distributed *(I will work on this for next time).*

There is only one traveller – to be completed by North, and checked by East.


If you wish to fill in a personal results card, they are available here. They are commonly used at duplicate clubs.

Any questions? Tea / coffee & biscuit. (20p) PLAY


There is no set tea break – take one when you finish a round of boards before the other tables.
